Village gallery has now been open for six weeks. The winter winds have started blowing through, the nights are closing in, and everyone is gearing themselves up for Christmas. Hopefully we can help with a range of gift ideas. We've a great selection of antique, less-old and new art, craft, ceramics, glass, jewellery, sculpture and silver. And particularly with the art and craft work, you know you will be investing in something unique.



- Anthony Bartyla is a stone carver from Dunnington near York. Anthony was initially drawn to masonry through his love of history and art, and was particularly inspired by York Minster. Some of the stonemasons working on the restoration of York Minster have been his mentors helping him to develop his skills and talent.

We've just refreshed some of our featured art ... the work of contemporary silversmiths Jon Braganza and Rebecca Joselyn, the batik art of Rebecca Joselyn and some limited edition prints of the work of Frank Martin are still here, as are the bronze sculptures of Edward Waites. Our new exhibitions feature the work of three very different artists:

- Lynn Shaw is an artist and photographer from Skipton North Yorkshire. Lynn's large canvas acrylic work centres round studies of the human body, her watercolour work focuses on flowers, whilst her photography has atmospheric scenic views. Throughout all her work her palette is limited to only three colours, inspired by the closing credits for the film 'Schindler's List' ... grayscale with a little girl dressed in a red coat (though Lynn often uses magenta in place of the red).



- Ralph Shuttleworth is a woodturning artist from Holmfirth in West Yorkshire. Ralph is self taught in the art of woodturning, and has developed some new techniques and processes that set his work apart from others. Ralph mainly uses reclaimed timber, or

native woods such as sycamore and ash, as an interesting natural canvas for turning, shaping and embellishing.

With Christmas in mind Royal Crown Derby and Lalique are always popular gifts, and with the sad closing of Mulberry Hall there hasn't really been anywhere in York stocking either of these names. We believe we have the best selection of Lalique in the county and can offer original René Lalique pieces from the 1920s though to brand new from the Lalique factory in France.
